More than 200,000 eligible for voluntary dental benefits plan effective January 1, 2022

elta Dental of Tennessee, the state's largest independent dental benefits carrier, has been awarded the contract by the Tennessee Department of Finance and Administration, Division of Benefits Administration for the State's fully-insured voluntary dental preferred provider organization program. The four-year contract takes effect on January 1, 2022.

"State employees are some of the hardest working members of our communities, and we look forward to providing a comprehensive, value-based dental benefit plan that promotes good oral and overall health," said Dr. Phil Wenk, President and CEO of Delta Dental of Tennessee. "Participants will have access to one of the largest provider networks in the state, ensuring they can access the care they need in their community, from routine preventive checkups and cleanings to a cavity filling or other procedures."



The plan is offered to State employees and retirees, as well as employees of agencies affiliated with the State benefits program. It is developed for the Delta Dental PPO<sup>SM</sup> network, which includes 74 percent of dentists in Tennessee.

Eligible employees and retirees can enroll in the plan during the annual enrollment period this fall.

Dentists can log into the Dental Office Toolkit for eligibility after Jan. 1.

# A Safety Net of state funding

It's truly something to smile about. Tennessee's Safety Net Denture Program will receive \$500,000 in state funding in 2022. Championed by the late Representative Charles Sargent, the program was developed to provide affordable dentures and partials for workingage Tennesseans.

But, when its state funding was cut due to the pandemic, the program's future was unknown. As a longtime supporter of Tennessee Charitable Care Network (TCCN), an association of more than 50 safety net healthcare clinics including 19 dental clinics, Delta Dental of Tennessee stepped in to cover the remaining gap in funding, more than \$220,000 at the end of May 2021. Now, state funding has been fully restored in this year's budget.

"We are so appreciative of Governor Lee and the legislature's continued support for the denture program," said Dr. Phil Wenk, CEO and president of Delta Dental of Tennessee. "This program is really about changing lives, and with funding back in the budget for next year, more hardworking Tennesseans like Samantha will be able to experience the transformative power of a smile."

We met Samantha, a Murfreesboro-based single mom of three, during Smile Power Week, and she credits Interfaith Dental Clinic with saving her life.

Four years ago, she was missing almost all her teeth and had significant pain and swelling in her face that made it difficult to eat or work; she eventually ended up in the ER, requiring emergency surgery, before a friend helped connect her to

the clinic.

"I was close to losing my life over my teeth,"
Samantha said. "Then I got a phone call, and
Interfaith said 'we hear you need an appointment,
we hear you're in pain' and I cried, because for
once in my life something was going right. Something good was happening to me, and I needed it.
Interfaith gave me that light."

Through the Safety Net Denture Program, Interfaith restored her smile and her confidence. Samantha's story is just one of many - the denture program has helped 4,700 Tennesseans like Samantha restore their smiles, confidence, and entire outlook on life since it launched in late 2016.



Delta Dental of Tennessee administers the Safety Net Denture Program at no cost to the state through its Smile180 Foundation. In 2020, Tennessee's Safety Net dental clinics served more than 39,850 patients who may otherwise not have received care. And, with the promise of \$500,000 in state funding, clinics can continue serving those patients in the year to come.

<u>Maximum Payment</u> - \$1,500 per person total per benefit year on all services, except cephalometric film, photos, diagnostic casts, and orthodontics. \$1,250 per person total per lifetime on cephalometric films, photos, and orthodontic services.

#### Deductible -

Delta Dental PPO Dentist - \$25 Deductible per person total per benefit year, limited to a maximum deductible of \$75 per family per benefit year. The deductible does not apply to oral exams, preventive, X-rays, sealants, full mouth debridement, cephalometric films, photos, and orthodontics.

Delta Dental Premier or Nonparticipating Dentist -\$100 Deductible per person total per Benefit Year limited to a maximum Deductible of \$300 per family per Benefit Year. The Deductible does not apply to oral exams, preventive, X-rays, sealants, full mouth debridement, cephalometric films, photos, and orthodontics.

# Grant program encourages students to drink more water

Good health habits start at a young age, and to help encourage kids to drink more water, Delta Dental of Tennessee has developed a grant program known as "Water's Cool @ School" to replace school water fountains with contactless Elkay bottle filling stations.

We received more than 150 applications from elemtary schools last year, and narrowing it down to the final list of 55 grant recipients was a challenge. Because of the incredible response to the 2020 program, we have decided to offer another round of grants this fall, providing 25 middle schools the opportunity to replace an existing water fountain with a bottle filling station.



# Shooting for perfect smiles with Brandan Wright

There was a different kind of uniform waiting for former Memphis Grizzlies player Brandan Wright at the Neighborhood Health Clinic at Napier Place Wednesday, July 14. Wright suited up in a white coat to be the Celebrity Dentist for a Day.

Teaming up with Delta Dental of Tennessee and Neighborhood Health, Wright guided Nashville kids through the clinic and into the dentist's chair for free dental screenings and fluoride.

From toddlers to teenagers, the patients learned about the importance of brushing and flossing, and that the dentist's chair isn't so intimidating. Overall health is a premise of Team Brandan Wright, his charitable foundation, and Wright wants to make sure oral health is included in that.

"I'm just interested in people being as healthy as they can," Wright said. "Last year was a prime example of what can happen when things go sideways. If you do the 'prehab,' the things before, you can make sure you prevent some of these things from escalating to levels that can turn deadly or that you can't come back from."

Each patient was given an oral hygiene kit from Delta Dental of Tennessee, a backpack from Team Brandan Wright, and the chance to shoot hoops with Wright and Marshall Molar.
