

## Ensuring healthy smiles is a team effort

he road to a healthy smile starts even before a person is born. With that in mind, Delta Dental of Tennessee's charitable arm, the Smile180 Foundation, announced a more than \$1 million commitment to the Cleft and Craniofacial Program at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt. The funds will

be used to establish the Delta Dental of Tennessee's Smile180 Foundation Directorship for the Cleft and Craniofacial Program, and to provide critical support as the program seeks to expand its services to care for more young patients and their families.

The Andersons are one family already seeing direct benefits from the Cleft and Craniofacial Program. With their "Prenatal to Prom" approach, the team at MCJCH at Vanderbilt diagnosed Judah Anderson's cleft lip before he was born and has performed procedures to correct it as he continues to grow. The commitment expands on Delta Dental's longstanding support for Children's Hospital. Since 2001, Delta Dental and Smile180 have donated more than \$2.3 million to Children's Hospital and supported various fundraising

events and initiatives.

# Understanding the patient experience

ue to requests of many customer and consumer demand, Delta Dental of Tennessee is participating along with all Delta Dental plans in the national implementation of the Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS) Dental Plan Survey. The anonymous survey is designed to provide a view into patients' overall experiences and satisfaction from every aspect of their dental care interactions including their dental plan, their dentist, and dental team members.

The CAHPS survey is a standardized national survey tool used in the health care industry to evaluate patient satisfaction. Patients will receive an email inviting them to take the survey following dental office visits, and they will only be surveyed once per year.

The results specific to experiences with your dental team and office staff will be shared once there are 30 or more responses from your patients, enough to provide a statistically valid assessment.

Patient information is confidential, so you will not know which patients have taken the Dental Plan Survey, or how individual patients responded. It will take some time to have 30 completed surveys for an individual dentist/office. Once that volume is reached, the Professional Relations Department will be reaching out to your office. ### Oral cancer support begins with preventive care

elta Dental of Tennessee is a constant advocate for the importance of oral and overall health. More than 90 percent of all systemic disease, including diabetes, leukemia, and heart disease, has oral characteristics that can be detected during a routine oral exam. That was the reality for Natalie Hennes. She was a 37-year-old mom of two, and she was the picture of health. Until she noticed a sore in her mouth that led her to her dentist and to a diagnosis of squamous cell carcinoma of the oral cavity.



Within a few weeks, Natalie underwent a 9-hour cancer removal and reconstructive surgery. Followed by several shorter reconstructive procedures. Scan the QR code to the left to see more of Natalie's journey.

"In those early days the nurses were feeding me through a feeding tube, I was on a machine that was breathing for me, I couldn't talk," Natalie said. "I mean pretty much anything that you think of as a human was taken away."

Every hour, 24-hours-a-day, 365-days-a-year, someone dies of oral or oropharyngeal cancer, which is cancer of the back of the oral cavity and upper throat. Yet when oral cancer is detected and treated early, treatment-related health problems are reduced, and survival rates may increase greatly.

When it comes to increasing quality of life for those fighting any type of cancer, Gilda's Club of Middle Tennessee is there to help.

An affiliate of the Cancer Support Community, Gilda's Club serves as a gathering place where people with cancer, and their friends and families, can find some answers throughout the daunting journey.

A friend of Natalie's told her about Gilda's Club, a place full of resources, from books and pamphlets spelling out the intricacies of all different kinds of cancer to port pillows and recipe books made specifically for the struggles patients must now accept as daily life.

But, more importantly, they find hope in the people who have been in their shoes and survived.

"To be able to talk to somebody who truly understands from that experience on that side of the experience as the patient can help mostly with the emotional and psychological trauma and damage you go through when you're diagnosed with cancer," Natalie said.

Gilda's Club offers specialized support groups for different types of cancer as well as support groups for families and friends of cancer patients. Delta Dental of Tennessee sponsors the Middle Tennessee Gilda's club's head and neck cancer support group.

Natalie is cancer free now, but she keeps coming back to Gilda's Club to help the next person who is diagnosed.

"There's things that we still all go through whether it's physical or psychological remembering things, but it's just that support system that is so desperately needed," Natalie said.

The Cancer Support Community has 175 locations worldwide consisting of 52 licensed affiliates and health care partnerships, including locations in Oak Ridge and Knoxville, Tennessee. For more information about Gilda's Club, visit their website at GildasClubMiddleTN.org.

### dental profession

he percent of dentists diagnosed with anxiety more than tripled in 2021 compared to 2003, according to the American Dental Association's newly released 2021 Dentist Health and Well-Being Survey Report. In many ways, the COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated the issue, causing staffing shortage to plague the profession, and adding more burdens to dentists and existing staff members.

But this state of affairs isn't new. While stigma surrounding mental health makes it difficult to say for sure, a U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention National Occupational Mortality Surveillance report for 1999-2010 showed that dentists were 2.5 times more likely to die by suicide than members of the general population. A 1996 study reported that being a dentist increased one's risk of suicide by a whopping 564%.

The statistics only get more staggering by the year, and they show the importance of caring for your own overall health as you care for your patients'. Fortunately, you don't have to do it on your own.

### Resources

The ADA has resources to help, including The New Dentist Committee. In collaboration with other divisions in the ADA, it is working with Chicago-based nonprofit Hope for the Day to add to the resources the ADA has to let dentists know that help is out there. There is also the ADA's Dentist Health and Wellness Program, composed of dentists and dental team members who are concerned about the health and well-being of their peers. The ADA website itself houses many resources on mental health at ADA.org/Wellness.

The Tennessee Suicide Prevention Network (TSPN) TSPN works across the state to eliminate the stigma of suicide and educate communities about the warning signs of suicide, with the ultimate intention of reducing suicide rates in the state of Tennessee. The organization provides a crisis call line, 1-855-CRISIS-1 (855-274-7471), as well as many resources online at tspn.org.
